In Year 1 we have been very busy planting carrots, zucchini, strawberries and tomatoes as part of the Fresh Tastes program. We had to clear the garden beds of weeds ready to plant our seedlings. Year 1 have also been learning about procedures in writing lessons. We have looked at and examined lots of different types of procedures, including recipes. Grevillea Unit



As part of their Humanities and Social Sciences Unit on the Gold Rush, 5I and 5R have been playing a Gold Rush game to find out what life was like as a prospector and learn how the gold rushes of the 1800's impacted and shaped the Australian Colonies. In the game, the students report to Commissioner Hollywood (Ms Riley) or Commissioner Longsdale (Mrs Irving). The students go panning for gold each day and then report to the assay office to get their findings valued. They also pick chance cards and run the risk of an injury or flood which can affect them personally or their whole class. The students are enjoying the game and learning about teamwork and resilience.

The SLSU have been busy learning about the life cycles of plants and animals during their current Science Unit. They planted sunflower seeds in Week 1 of this term and have been recording their observations of their plants' growth each week. The students have also been busy planting and caring for the garden beds outside the Grevillea Unit and in the unit sensory area. They have planted tomatoes, french beans, carrots, strawberries as well as cucumber and pumpkin plants. The plants are growing well except for a few of the plants which have been nibbled on by birds or snails.

Scripture in Schools Program



Caroline Chisholm School will be hosting the Scripture in Schools Program team in Week 7, Term 4. If you are new to our school and would like your child to participate, please see the front office for information and a consent form.

Our school has received a request from parents for their children to receive Christian Education as part of our school curriculum, based on provisions in the Education Act 2004.

At this point in time, the Christian Education program available to our school is the Scripture in Schools Program. It comprises 4 lessons during Term 1 focusing on the Christian celebration of Easter and 4 lessons during Term 4 focusing on the Christian celebration of Christmas. Children permitted to attend the program will be placed in age-appropriate groups during the lessons.

Parent permission is essential for children to attend the Scripture in Schools Program. To assist the Christian Education coordination process at our school, please see the front office to indicate your interest in your children attending the Scripture in Schools Program, Term 4 2018.

If you gave consent for your child to attend the Easter program, they will get to attend automatically. If you would like to change your consent (whether to opt in or opt out) simply contact the front office.
