Year 2 is well into writing persuasive texts this semester in Literacy. We are learning that we use persuasive writing (or expositions) to convince you to change your mind and/or take action. Year 2 has been working hard writing persuasive

texts to convince you of the importance of the Great Barrier Reef and how to save it. We are also trying to influence your choice when purchasing a pet and arguing the reasons as to why we should have a pool at school! We will also be writing narratives this term so be prepared to be entertained by our fantastic narrative writing.

In Maths Year 2 continues to work on our quick recall of number bonds to twenty, our ability to use a variety of strategies (such as the jump and split strategy) for addition and subtraction and the relationship multiplication has to division. We are also looking at money – connecting the value of each coin, connecting this to buying products and note and the different ways we can use money to make the same amount in different ways.



We are continuing our health unit looking at healthy eating, getting enough exercise and developing respectful relationships with our peers. Year 2 also has a strong focus on developing a growth mindset and learning how to look after our thoughts to keep our minds healthy.

Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS)

Several Year 8 classes have been selected to take part in the Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS) which will be held on 13 November. TIMSS is an important educational research project investigating student achievement in mathematics and science. More than 60 countries, including Australia, are participating in this study. TIMSS is an important activity to keep us, as parents and citizens, informed about how our students in Australia are performing in comparison to their peers in other countries and to compare programs of study and teaching practices. We will be able to obtain current national and international information which will help improve the teaching and learning of mathematics and science in our country.

Selected students will do an assessment in mathematics and science and complete a questionnaire about their experiences at home and school. There is no need for students to study specifically for the assessment as it will not affect individual students' grades or progress in school.

All data will be kept strictly confidential and no individual student or school will be identified in published data or reports.

If your child has been selected to be part of the study, they will be informed closer to the testing date.

School Banking News

ATTENTION - NO BANKING IN WEEK 10

Friday, 14 December 2018 (Week 9)

will be the last week of student banking for this year.

Last day for ordering rewards is **Friday, 7 December 2018**

(Week 8). Any rewards ordered after this date will not be dispatched from CBA until February.

Student Banking will resume every FRIDAY from Week 1, Term 1, 2019. Deposit wallets are to be left with the JC Front Office by 9am and are returned to the student's classrooms.

Students who are moving to the Senior campus may continue to bank, deposit wallets are to be left with Senior campus Front Office and students can collect them again from the office in the afternoon.

Holiday banking tip: To qualify for bonus interest on your account, you must make at least one deposit per calendar month and no withdrawals. Most students banking regularly at school meet this criteria throughout the school year. Making a deposit at a CBA branch during January, ensures you will continue to be eligible for your bonus interest all year round :)
