Principal's Report

Dear Chisholm Families

STEM @ CCS

Our School Board Chair, Dianna Small, P&C President Lisa Maybury and I are delighted to announce that 6.5 million dollars has been allocated in the ACT budget for a *Centre for Innovation and Learning* to be built at Caroline Chisholm School senior campus. STEM refers to Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. There is growing national and international recognition of the public benefits that a STEM education brings to the community and individual. The Centre will develop a core STEM education for students incorporating inspirational teaching, inquiry-based learning and critical thinking. It will place science literacy alongside language and numeracy proficiency as a priority. This is an exciting opportunity for students who attend Caroline Chisholm and other Tuggeranong schools.

Outstanding Achievements

As principal, I often reflect on what indicators in a student's performance constitutes excellence and I find that I am equally impressed by the top performance the students display when taking on a learning challenge across all subject areas. At CCS our Awards System is connected to our House System. A House Point is awarded to recognise that a student has contributed to the CCS community in one of the three categories – Citizenship, Academic and Participation. As students earn a predetermined number of House Points, they accumulate an individual tally which can earn individual Awards. There are 4 Award levels on the Senior Campus, which can be earned in the three categories. They are Bronze Award, Silver Award, Gold Award and Principal's Award.

It gives me great pleasure to present to you these exceptional students who are recent recipients of a Gold Award.

This program will support students who are struggling with time management as well as positive learning behaviours to stay on top of their work.

Another popular option to help with keeping on top of work is the Homework Club on Monday and Wednesday afternoons from 3-4.30pm. We have recently been noticing a huge increase in numbers attending, taking the opportunity to get an early start on some assessment as well as students inviting their classroom teacher to assist with learning.



Immunisations

In round 2 of immunisations, the students will only be receiving 1 vaccine, which will be the second dose of Gardasil. If a child was absent, unwell or refused in Round 1, they will be receiving their 1st dose of Gardasil in this round and in round 3 will receive dose 2. Parents will be sent home a letter at the end of the year with any missed doses, which they will be able to receive from their GP surgery after December 2015.

Helpful hints for students on the day:

- Eat a substantial breakfast and drink plenty of water
- Come and see the nurses first thing if they feel particularly anxious
- If possible to wear sports uniform (to allow easier access to the upper arm)

MIDDLE YEARS

We are just over halfway through the term, which means assessments and assignments have been handed out for most subjects and students might be feeling more stressed and 'under-the-pump' than usual. Please keep checking their diaries as this will be the main piece of communication from the classroom to home. Below are just a few things the Middle Years team wanted to let you know about.

Getting prepared for Winter @ CCS.

As the weather gets colder, it's important that we get prepared for that inevitable icy wind that blows across the Brindabellas and through our school grounds. A few things to remember:

- If you haven't already done so, please visit our uniform shop on Thursday from 2.30pm – 3.30pm to organise a jumper and a jacket. They do take a while to come in, so don't leave it too late to order! Once you've ordered and paid for the clothing, just get your student to take the receipt to the front office or Wellbeing and they will be issued a Uniform Pass. A Uniform Pass allows your child to wear a non-uniform jumper until they receive their uniform order.
- Invest in some layers. Tights worn under track pants, singlets and long sleeved tops under shirts all help keep students warm. Just make sure anything that can be seen is in 'colour code'. That is, long sleeved undershirts need to be plain navy blue or white. Gloves, scarves and beanies can protect students from the biting wind. Navy blue and white are the best colours to go for, but we have some flexibility around the colours of these things, as they are not provided as part of our uniform.

HPE Practical Lessons

During HPE lessons, your child's HPE Class will still be going outside for practical lessons. When we are prepared for the cold, getting out into the fresh air for a run around after being cooped up all day makes us feel amazing! However, please ensure they are prepared with black track pants or tights / skins (or even both!), layers up top, a beanie, gloves and a scarf. They won't be marked down for *not* having these, but being warm, even when outside in the cold weather, makes it much easier to participate fully and get the most out of our short time.

Year 7 and 8 Ski Trip

The Year 7 and 8 Ski Trip is going ahead. We very excitingly received minimum numbers before the final RSVP date (well done for being so organised) and are pleased to announce that we are now taking a larger bus. We are operating a waiting list for those students who didn't quite get their notes in on time, so if your child missed out, you may still be able to get place if someone pulls out of the excursion. More information about this will be sent home next week.

There may still be some ski clothing left over at ALDI from their sale 2 weeks ago, and very soon there will be the annual Oakley sale, held at EPIC, where you can pick up some great ski gear at significantly reduced prices. Keep your eyes peeled! Also, you don't have to buy ski clothing - don't rule out borrowing from friends and family to save yourself the cost of purchasing these items.
