PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Families

I am happy to say that we have progressed through the middle part of this term with a very 'learning focussed' atmosphere within the school. Caroline Chisholm School (CCS) - both Junior and Senior Campus'- is busy navigating through the enrolment processes for 2018. We have experienced a lot of interest in the school which while being very encouraging, does place some enrolment pressure on all year groups. If you know of any in-area families that want to come to CCS in 2018 but are yet to enrol, please ask them contact the school **ASAP**. We have quite a number of out of Priority Enrolment Area families that we are unable to take at this point until all of our numbers are finalised.

NAPLAN

CCS has again achieved some solid results in the NAPLAN testing carried out early in Term 2. Our students had 90% of our mean scores above the Tuggeranong average out of the 5 areas tested across years 3, 5, 7 and 9. This strongly validates the excellent work our teachers do every day to get the best out of our students. NAPLAN is just one

assessment in a point of time, and therefore not the most statistically valid of tools at times, but other information and learning results I have analysed across the school mirror this story.

Centre for Innovation and Learning

You will have noticed that the structural steel is now up in the new STEM building and that it is starting to take shape. I will be visiting a number of schools in Sydney, as well as some of the executive staff in the NSW Department of Education, to help inform the learning programs that will be developed and delivered from the centre. We want to have a strong focus on developing the important skills required for students to access STEM subjects; those of critical thinking, complex problem solving, collaboration and creative thinking. These skills are highly sought after by employers who are operating in an ever changing and complex work environment.



Limelight and Dance Fest

I wish our Junior Campus students all the best for our performance at Limelight on Thursday evening at the AIS. This is an exciting opportunity for them to perform in front of a large crowd and have been rehearsing diligently to ensure they perform to the best of their ability. Our Senior Campus students have also been madly preparing for their DanceFest performance held at The Canberra Theatre later this term. This is always a fun night and I am sure the students will once again do us proud. 

Student Injury Insurance and Ambulance Transport

The Education Directorate does not provide any insurance cover for injury, disease or illness to students resulting from school activities or school-organised excursions. Claims for compensation are met where there is a legal liability to do so. Liability is not automatic and depends on the circumstances in which any injury, disease or illness was sustained.

As there is no automatic insurance cover for personal injury if your child is injured at school or during a school or organised activity/excursion you should therefore consider whether taking out personal insurance cover for your child is warranted.

This insurance might cover contingencies including medical/hospital expenses, ambulance transport outside the ACT, and cancellation of transport/accommodation or loss of/damage to luggage.

The ACT Ambulance Service provides free ambulance transport for students who are injured or suddenly become illed at school or during an approved school organised activity within the ACT.
