School Satisfaction & Climate Survey

As part of our continuous effort to improve ACT schools, each year the Education Directorate invites all parents and carers, school staff and students in years 4 to 12 to give feedback through the school.

It is time for our annual school satisfaction and climate survey. This year, the survey opens on Friday, 18 August and closes on Friday, 8 September 2023. All students from year 4 to 10, staff and parents and carers will receive a survey invitation directly to their school or registered email address from the survey platform Qualtrics. Your responses will help our school to identify what we do well and how we can improve. The data will also be used to underpin school improvement practices and inform government priorities, as well as in research projects and longitudinal studies aimed at improving the quality of education services in the ACT. Your participation is entirely voluntary, but we do hope you will help. It is important that as many students, staff and parents and carers complete the survey as possible to ensure the results accurately reflect the views and experiences of our whole school community. If you have more than one young person at CCS, you are welcome to complete one or more surveys.

E-Safety: Parent and Carer Webinar Series

A number of webinars are now available for families to access to assist parents and carers understand non-consensual sharing of intimate images. The webinars are designed for parents and carers of young people aged 13 to 18 years. Participants will learn about:

- the difference between online sexual harassment and image-based abuse
- how to report online sexual harassment and image-based abuse to social media companies
- how to report image-based abuse to the Office of the e-Safety Commissioner and when to report to police.
- where to get support if you feel upset or worried about something that has happened online.



Physical Activity



Focus of Ability Film Festival





Welcome to Term 3, and what a big term it has been all ready. Students in the flex space have had a busy and successful start to the term. Students have participated in the Athletics Carnival, which involved cheering their friends on and growing their house connection and spirit.











Year 7 students have been exploring the novel, "Blueback" written by Tim Winton. They have had the opportunity to explore each chapter on a deeper level, inferring what the author is sharing and how this can present emotions and increasing their vocabulary.

In maths, we have been exploring Area and Perimeter, calculating the answers and processes for working these out for regular and irregular shapes. The students have been cementing their knowledge of both Mathematics and English concepts through hands on rotations, supporting each other to achieve their outcomes.

Students participated in the NAIDOC week celebrations. The students had the opportunity to learn about Aboriginal and Torres Strait islander culture through story, interactive dance, and music with Ryker Ali.


