### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



I hope you all had the opportunity to spend some quality time with your children over the last couple of weeks. We look forward to another term of wonderful learning across the school. At the end of last term, you received a letter from Katy Haire, our Director General, informing you that the Education Directorate is doing all it can to minimise any disruption in school due to ongoing Covid outbreaks and the recognised teacher shortage.

Please rest assured at a school level that we will do all that is possible too. This week years Seven and Eight went to camp and we hope they have an excellent time learning new skills, finding new friends, and making precious memories.

As your principal for this term, I should introduce myself. I trained and taught as a high school teacher for ten years before making the move into primary schools 18 years ago. I've been a principal since 2011 and am the co-vice president (primary) of the principal's association, being a strong advocate for the profession.

This means I attend a few more meetings than most principals in the ACT and interstate, but I know the team here can lead the school exceptionally well in my absence. I'm also an evaluation leader (an assessor/reviewer) for International Baccalaureate schools but try to limit these processes outside of school time where possible.

Originally from the UK, we emigrated here 23 years ago on ANZAC Day. In my spare time I go for long runs (I do the Canberra Marathon each year and average 50kms each week), eat unhealthy food too often(!), and am studying for a doctorate in education.

I've really enjoyed my first few days at school, getting to know the children better (although I need to get over to the junior campus more frequently) and meeting a few of the parents. 
### **School Improvement Update Term 2 2023**

Across the last term we have continued to work towards our strategic priority of: Improve students' academic, personal, and social capabilities through holistic learning experiences.

To achieve this priority, our focus areas for 2023 have been in a range of areas across both campuses including using evidence informed practices, differentiation of teaching strategies, capturing a whole-school K-10 sequenced curriculum and scoping and sequencing personal and social capabilities.

Our staff are growing the ways in which they use evidence of student progress in their daily practice to plan for the next teaching sequences. Our JC staff use a range of formal and informal assessment tools. For example, formal assessments such as Probe and PM Reading assessments, SENA and MYMC (maths) and Words Their Way are used kindergarten to year 6. Staff across both campuses use Common Formative Assessments, usually in the form of a rubric, to set explicit criteria for student performance. The intended learning is communicated to students throughout lessons and sequences of learning. These components are important within the classroom if we are to support our learners to understand what we intend for them to learn, how we will know they have learned it and where to next with their learning.

We are also continuing to embed the Berry St Education Model P-10; focusing on the first three domains which are called 'Body', 'Relationship' and 'Stamina'. Work has been done to grow the focus from positive primers to growth mindsets and constant positive regard for each other. The focus is on creating a culture of academic persistence by nurturing resilience, emotional intelligence, and a growth mindset. We continue to seek ways to collect evidence of our progress and impact in this space.


