#### **Transitions**

There are many transition events across term 4, we look forward to supporting our students at all levels of education.

#### Preschool 2023

We were fortunate to meet many of our preschoolers for 2023 in term three. Our formal transition visits will commence in the coming fortnight with the start of the week group visiting preschool on Tuesday 29 November between 9.30am and 10.15am. Our end of the week preschoolers will visit on Thursday 1 December between 9.30am and 10.15am. I encourage you to speak with your preschooler about their experiences on this visit and continue to prepare your child for the transition to preschool by practising some independence around packing items into their school bag such as hats and jumpers, and opening and closing lunch boxes. These actions will assist your child begin to understand some of the daily actions that they will undertake at school. Of course we will continue to build on these skills next year!

#### Kindergarten 2023

While our preschoolers attend the JC hall and library for a range of experiences and learning opportunities throughout the year, our formal transition program for 2023 is underway. Our preschool students will spend time in the kindergarten classrooms in the coming weeks to experience a range of learning opportunities. The Pelicans will visit kindergarten on Tuesday 29 November between 9.30am and 10.45am. The Rosellas will visit kindergarten on Thursday 1 December between 9.30am and 10.45am. Please take the time to speak with your children about their experiences and continue to speak openly about the transition to school to support your child with this important transition.


#### Perrie


#### YEAR 8

### DO NOW:


- List three negative effects of urbanisation.


#### LSU K-6


Students have been working very hard with their learning this term.

For Science, we have been learning about plant and animal cells and the life cycles of frogs.

To consolidate their learning, students have drawn images of plant and animal cells and have recreated their drawings in a clay 3D model.







For Social and Emotional Learning, students have been guided through the traditional Japanese process of Suminagashi.

For this exercise, students were given a brush filled with ink and another loaded with water. Students then dropped the brushes in a tray of water to create concentric circles.

The process is meant to be meditative and designed to create a sense of mindfulness.

For our design and technology unit we created a kindergarten 'Tiny Town'. After learning about different types of shelter and the important features of places we designed and planned our own houses. We labelled the different features and the materials we would use and then started building. Once our houses were painted we moved in.

We created roads, parks, waterways, playgrounds, ovals and even a 'teacher island' where Jordan and Ms. Courtney lived on a farm. It was so much fun and we were very proud of what we achieved. We invited classes from around the school for a tour of the town and we think they loved it too!
