# <u>Event + Response/Reaction = Outcome</u>

Over the past year we have continued to focus on working with our students to understand the choice they have of responding or reacting to events. This language explores the notion that an event plus a response (preferred behaviour) or reaction (less desirable action) can impact the outcome of situation. For instance, if negative interactions have occurred online, by choosing a response where these interactions are reported to the eSafety Commissioner and the subsequent account is blocked/reported/unfollowed, then the outcome can be impacted. While the outcome can never truly be controlled, by being an upstander and

taking a positive response, we can impact on things that upset or offend us. By reacting with equal levels of abuse, often the outcome is that we get further upset by a 'tit for tat' situation. The same principle can be applied to many different situations from a playground disagreement or after school interaction. I encourage you to speak with your young people at home about this analogy. We are continuing to embed this thinking across the school in our conversations with students to grow their capacity to respond to conflict and manage difficult situations.

### **Enrolments 2024**

Enrolments for 2024 (preschool, kindergarten, year 7, year 11) open early next term. The process to apply for enrolment is to complete the online enrolment application located on our Directorate's website. Once you submit your application, a copy will be automatically emailed to your nominated email address (that you include on the form) and to the school.

The enrolment timeline has been released and the following dates and times apply:

- 26 April 2022 (6:00am) online enrolment opens.
- 3 June 2022 (11:59pm) enrol by this date to receive an offer from 25 July 2022.
- Applications made after 4 June will receive an offer later in the year.

The Online Enrolment form will be updated for the 2024 school year on 24 April 2023. # **Senior Campus - Flexible Space**

Students in the flexible space have had a busy start to term, having the opportunity to engage with activities for the curriculum as well as enrichment and leadership opportunities. Year 7 students have settled into the high school routine.

Year 7 have been exploring social justice issues, poetic techniques, slam poetry and are in the process of creating their own personalised slam poem on a chosen social justice issue, applying all techniques learnt in their English classes. In mathematics for Year 7 and 8, they have explored the concept of BEDMAS (Bracket, Exponent, Division, Multiplication, Addition and Subtraction). They have increased their knowledge and understanding of each component, creating their own BEDMAS questions for their peers to work out the answer. # **Career Development**

<u>Work Experience</u> assists young people in making informed decisions about their future. Multiple placements are possible throughout the year. Students see the Careers teacher to plan.

<u>College Enrolment</u> opens online on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April. I will be preparing a detailed letter to give Year 10 students and email to families as soon as the details are available on the Education Directorate's website. Generally I am able to distribute it before the Easter break. Fingers crossed.

<u>Construction Safety Courses - Easter holidays</u> - There are still spaces in these courses.

The CIT is holding White Card, Asbestos Awareness and Crystalline Silica Exposure Prevention training for high school and college students only, please see below for dates, times, location and costs.

Everyone, including school students requires both White Card and Asbestos Awareness Cards to enter a building site. The Silica Awareness Training is optional for school students. The Education Directorate have advised ACT schools as follows: "Students are not required to undertake the Silica Exposure Prevention course when undertaking work experience in the construction and building industries, unless they are undertaking an ASBA. Students attending work experience should be prohibited from duties that involve exposure to Crystalline Silica. Students will be required to shadow a qualified tradesperson who has completed Silica Awareness Training. Students cannot undertake practical work on or near these Crystalline Silica products, even if they have completed the course."

White Card - \$75 Mon 17 Apr 2023 - 9:00 AM to 3:30 PM - C202 - <u>CIT Bruce Campus</u>

Asbestos Awareness - \$75 Tues 18 Apr 2023 - 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM - C202 - CIT Bruce Campus

Silica Exposure Prevention – \$240 Tues 18 Apr 2023 - 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM - A207 – CIT Bruce Campus

Once you receive your electronic certificate from CIT you will have 60 days to apply for the white card online through <u>Access</u> <u>Canberra</u>. If you do not apply within 60-days, you will be required to do the training again.

To enrol, please read the attached enrolment instructions. Fill in the Word document and send it back to Richi with a message on the email saying" I agree" to the terms and conditions. Richi will email you regarding payment and a place in the courses will be confirmed after payment is made.

Also, students will be required to provide 100 points of identification on the day of the training (see attached for requirements, photos saved on a phone are acceptable).














To get ABSTUDY your child needs to be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander Australian student

The type of payments and how much you can get depends on your and your child's situation



### Your child is 15 or younger

If your child lives at home for high school, ABSTUDY can help you pay for things like:

- uniforms
- textbooks and stationery
- · school fees

You can get a yearly payment to help with school fees.

You can also get a payment 4 times a year at the start of each school term. To get this, your child has to attend school for at least 85% of each school term.

For some students, we also pay a higher rate of the yearly payment to help with school fees. You can usually get this if your child is attending a fee-paying school because they can't go to a local government school.

If you get Family Tax Benefit for your child, this won't stop. You can keep getting it until they turn 16.



#### Your child is 16 or older

When your child turns 16 they may get other ABSTUDY payments. This includes a fortnightly payment to help with living costs.

#### Steps to claim ABSTUDY



### Call the ABSTUDY line on 1800 132 317

If your child is 15 or younger, you need to call to claim. If they're 16 or older, they should call us themselves.

You can give information about you and your child over the phone. This includes the name of your child's school and your bank account details.

Send or upload documents if ABSTUDY asks you to

Wait for a letter from ABSTUDY It will tell you if your claim for ABSTUDY is approved.

If your claim gets rejected and you aren't sure why, you can call the ABSTUDY line and ask.



#### When you should claim

Claim from October in the year before your child starts high school.

If they've already started high school make sure you claim before 31 December. That way we'll be able to pay you ABSTUDY payments for the year

If your child is about to turn 16 they should call us. They could be eligible for other ABSTUDY payments from when they turn 16.
